## Commitment to Achieve Net Zero

Sunrise Medical is committed to achieving net zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2050 across its operations and value chain. This commitment covers emissions reported under the Greenhouse Gas Protocol (Scopes 1, 2 and 3).

### **Sunrise Medical commits to:**

Net Zero by 2050 or earlier for Scopes 1, 2 and 3.

42% reduction by 2030 (in line with Paris Agreement) for Scopes 1 & 2.

Bi-annual reporting of GHG emissions and progress

Integration of circular economy principles including **product refurbishment and remanufacturing**

This plan is approved by the **Executive Leadership Team** and will be reviewed annually.

## Carbon Reduction Targets

### Scope 1 and 2 Targets (Paris-Aligned)

- **42% reduction by 2030** (from baseline)
- **Net zero by 2050**

Reduction pathways will follow **Science Based Targets Initiative (SBTi) methodology** aligned with limiting warming to **1.5°C**. Primary strategies:

- Electrification of manufacturing processes
- Renewable electricity procurement
- Energy efficiency in manufacturing
- Electrification of vehicle fleet

### Scope 3 Target

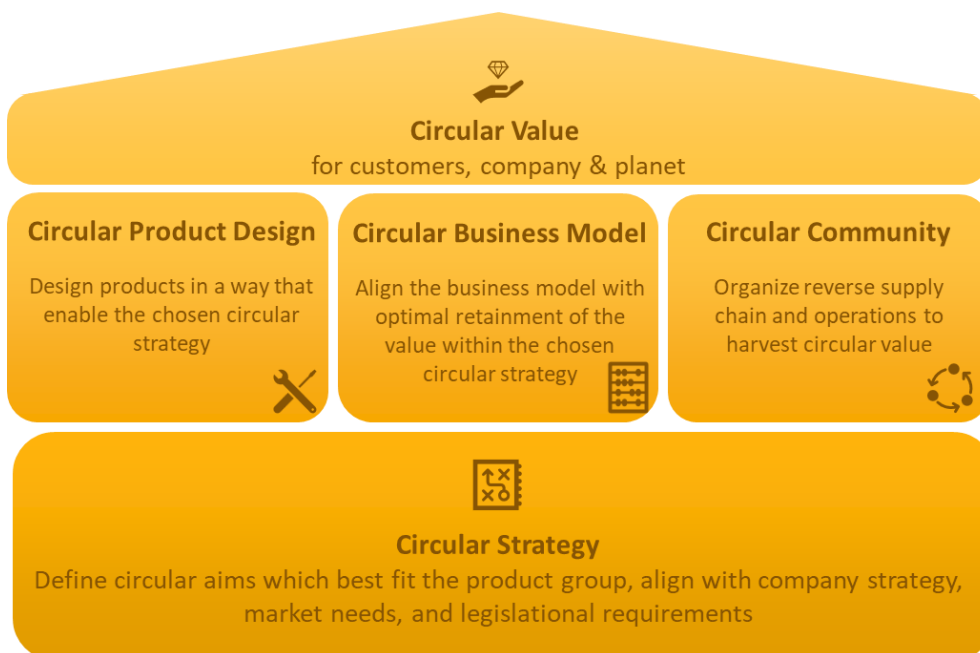
- **Net Zero Scope 3 emissions by 2050**

Scope 3 emissions represent the majority of the company's carbon footprint due to the impact of 'Purchased goods and services' and the 'Use of sold products'

# Scope 3 Reduction Strategy

## Circular Value Program

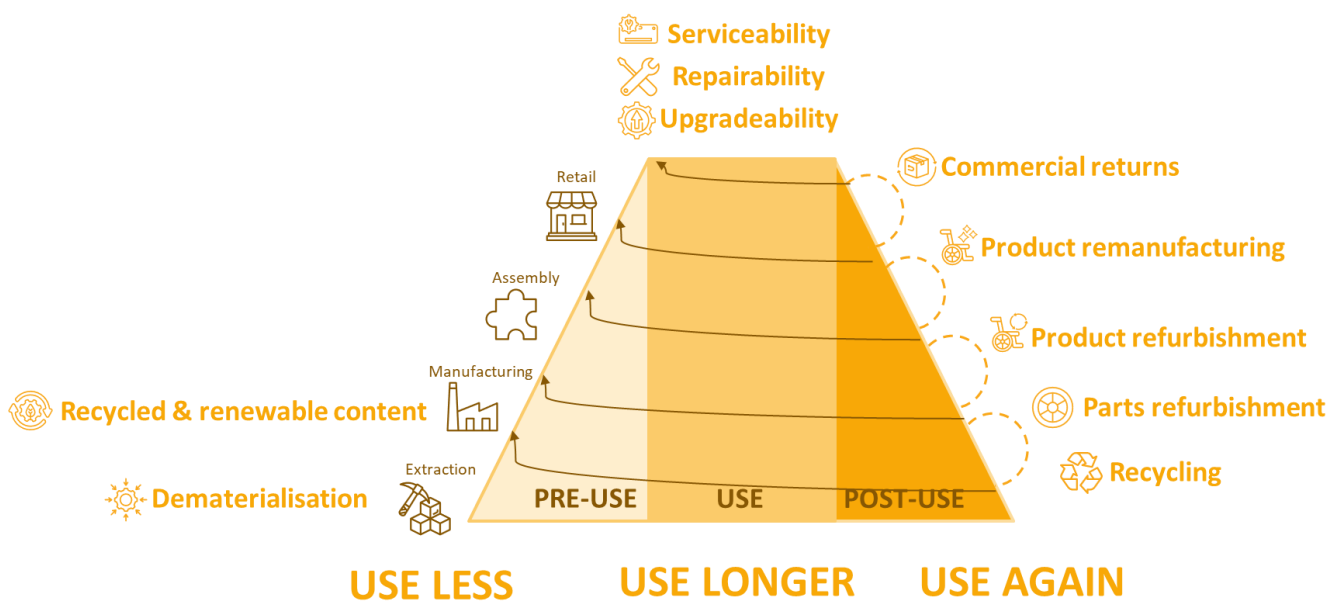
- The largest opportunity for emissions reduction lies in **product lifecycle extension**.
- Mobility devices and parts often remain structurally functional beyond their initial service life. Sunrise Medical will implement a **Circular Value Program** to reduce emissions associated with manufacturing new products.



## Circular strategy

The foundation of Sunrise Medicals strategy is insights obtained through Life Cycle Analysis (LCA) of the products. These analysis are done in accordance with ISO 14040 and ISO 14044 and follow Product Category Rules (PCR) where available.

Insights from LCA reports identify 'hotspots' and enable Sunrise Medical to prioritise their reduction initiatives and areas. This shapes the decision making for Circular Aims. Depending on the LCA outcomes, product and market area, the most impactful Circular Aim(s) are selected. The circular aims are based on the different sections of the Value Hill.



## Circular Product Design

Different elements from the product design contribute to different Circular Aims. Sunrise Medical has identified Circular Design Enablers. These enablers provide guidance for product development teams to maximise the gains from the selected Circular Aims. With the right design principles in place Sunrise Medical is capable of reducing the initial impact of their products, optimise efficiency and longevity during the use of the products and maximise value retention at end of life phase.

## **Circular Business Models**

Sunrise Medical strives to have circularity fully integrated into their way of working. By ensuring business models are aligned with both upstream and downstream partners, Sunrise Medical believes this creates sustainable businesses for all stakeholders. Making Sunrise Medical a robust and reliable partner while driving carbon reduction.

## **Circular Community**

Only by working together with value chain partners (both upstream and downstream) Sunrise Medical believes circular value creation can be maximised. Sunrise Medical therefore works closely together with their existing partners and is continuously expanding their network to increase capabilities. Sunrise Medical works closely together with sheltered workshop and work development companies to support (local) communities.

## **Circular Value**

The effects of the Circular Value Programme are quantified through LCA reports and discussed with value chain partners to track performance and plan next reduction opportunities. Sunrise Medical actively works on the development of Product Category Rules (PCRs) and is a founding member and co-initiator of the “Medical Mobility Devices and Care Assistive Products” - PCR (registered at EPD International). This will enable the entire market to develop Environmental Product Declarations (EPDs) and communicate, verified, on the product footprints.

## Additional Emissions Reduction Measures

### Manufacturing

- Environmental Management System, ISO 14001 certified
- Renewable electricity procurement
- Waste reduction initiatives and best-practice sharing

### Logistics

- Shipment consolidation
- Lower carbon transport modes
- Optimized distribution networks

### Supply Chain

- Sustainable supplier selection
- Centralised distribution centres
- Supplier decarbonization programs
